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RUTGERS-CAMDEN'S ENGLAND NAMED PHILADELPHIA INQUIRER ACADEMIC ALL-AREA WOMEN'S TRACK AND FIELD PERFORMER OF THE YEAR

PHILADELPHIA – Robin England of Rutgers University-Camden has been named the 2010 *Philadelphia Inquirer* All-Area Women's Track and Field Performer of the Year as voted on by the Philadelphia Area College Sports Information Directors Association (Philly-SIDA).

England, a junior economics major, was honored as the New Jersey Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (NJAIW) Woman of the Year in 2008-09. She is a four-time *Philadelphia Inquirer Academic All-Star* for cross country and track and field and was named Performer of the Year in women's cross country back in 2008. A standout both on the field and in the classroom, England is a member of the Dean's List while taking classes in the Rutgers-Camden Honors College. She was honored by the United States Track and Field Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) as a member of the Division III Women's All-Academic Cross Country Team in 2007 and 2009. In 2009, she earned 2009 Academic All-district Second Team honors in cross country and track. She is a two-time New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) Academic first team honoree.

On the track, England holds four outdoor track records in the 800 M, 3,000 M, 5,000 M, and 10,000 M. She also holds eight indoor track school records. Individually, she holds records in the 800 M, 1,000 M, 3,000 M, 5,000 M, mile, and is a member of the record holding 4x400, 4x800 and Distance Medley relays. In cross country, she holds the top times in the 5K and 6K. England was the 2010 outdoor track champion (10,000 M) and 2009 outdoor track champion (5,000 M). In 2009, she was named All-Atlantic Region for cross country while also garnishing NJAC First-Team and a NJAIW champion. An eight-time team MVP for cross country, indoor and outdoor track, England is a team captain and has earned all-conference accolades in all three sports. A member of the Student Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), England will return to the Raptors for her senior year in the fall.

England is joined by Bryn Mawr's Akua Nyame-Mensah; Cheyney's Stephanie Orji; Gwynedd-Mercy's Alycia Tranchitella, Haverford's Aileen Keogh and Mara Miller; La Salle's Stephanie Bearish; Penn's Anna Agenes; Rowan's Amirah Muneer and Rutgers-Camden's Jen Baciu.
